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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Government Rajkumar Dhiraj Singh college udaipur is affiliated to Sant Gahira Guru University Ambikapur Surguja. The college established on 1th July, 2006 with the faculty of Art, Commerce, Science, the college started its work from higher secondary school and Janpad Panchayat Bhawan Udaipur, presently it was shifted its own building, which is well equipped with all college facilities. The college named after 'RAJKUMAR DHIRAJ SINGH' a freedom fighter, who was sentenced to Kaala- Pani for his armed rebellion against the British.

The college is located near Sontarai village on katghora- Ambikapur NH-130 only, 4 km away from world famous Paleolithic Sitabengra- Jogimara cave, in Ramgarh hill, where Mahakavi Kalidas composed his famous Khand-Kavya MEGHDOOTAM.

Situated on the foothill of Ramgarh hill, covered with teak forests, mainly rural and tribal students get education in this college, where the number of girls students has been recorded greater than the boys students.

The college started its journey in 2006 with 82 students, which has reached to 501 in the current academic year 2021-22. The college has a reach library facility where not only textbook but also reference books and the books for preparation of competitive exams are available. NSS unit and Red Cross society also have been established here, which plays a major role in the development of discipline, spirit of social service and moral values along with education among the students.

Vision

Holistic development of the students through quality higher education and to groom them sensible citizen of the country.

Mission

Mission of the institution is to make quality higher education accessible to all sections of society, including the tribal population of the locality of Surguja district in the state of Chhattisgarh to enhance skill of the youth for self reliant and sustainable development. The college strives to provide a platform for the students of rural area to groom and enhance their ability and talents with quality and value based education.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

1. College is situated in the lap of nature in calm and clean environment with fruit trees, mango, Sal-teak in abundance, in such a proper environment is available for study.
2. Teachers provide education to the students with good care in a supportive environment, 29 CCTV

cameras have been installed in the campus for continuous monitoring and security of the college. Education is being provided keeping in mind the rural and tribal environment.

3. The functioning of the college is transparent and well organized.
4. NSS, Red Cross, and sports activity are working effectively.
5. Dedicated hardworking, disciplined, student's friendly and well qualified teachers and present.
6. Ragging is a punishable offense in the college and no case of ragging has been registered here so far.
7. Students' enrollment in the college is increasing every year. Despite being in limited facilities, and rural tribal area, there is a strong awareness among the students towards education, specially the number of girls students is more than boy students.
8. The students here are simple, soft spoken, obedient, and disciplined.
9. College is constantly striving in the development and spread of traditional and cultural values along with institutional values.

Institutional Weakness

1. Lack of job oriented course.
2. Being in rural environment, there is a problem of Wi-Fi and internet connectivity.
3. There is a lack of boundary wall, canteen, and cycle stand.
4. The development program of sustainable energy has not yet been implemented.
5. Lack of permanent faculty.

Institutional Opportunity

1. College can play an effective role for the development of students living in rural tribal environment and to do great motivation by setting a definite goal in their life.
2. The college has ample opportunity to pursue the girls students of rural tribal area in higher education.
3. Opportunity is available to motivate the students for higher education and competitive exams.
4. Green campus is likely to be used better in teaching and learning, such an environment is helpful in increasing creativity.

Institutional Challenge

1. Most of the students come from economically backward and under privileged areas.
2. It is challenging to enhance academic quality, encourage research activity, and keep students motivated to continue reading and moving forward.
3. To continuously enhance the English language, communications skills, personality development in the corrective direction.
4. To boost the morale of the students for advanced study of digital learning and computer education etc.
5. Limited study and innovative tools.
6. Weak communication skills of students.
7. The college is located away from the city, so students face inconvenience in reaching the college.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Government Rajkumar Dhiraj Singh College, Udaipur Is affiliated to Sant Gahira Guru University, Surguja and it is working under Higher Education Department of Chhattisgarh government. It is a co-educational government institution where the number of girl's students is more than boys' students.

Undergraduate programmes run by the College in which are B.Sc., B.A., B.com courses in Hindi literature and English literature are also available. Effective delivery is ensured by the College by formulating its plan and strategy according to the syllabus. Our college follows the curriculum of Sant Gahira Guru University. Here's the unit of Red Cross programs of sports activities are for the all round development of the students through which inclusive development of the student is insured.

Connecting to the outer world, along with the curricular activities and exposure to the real world widen the knowledge and experience of the students. Issues of contemporary subjects like global warming, migrant problem, economic inequality, women empowerment, monetary policy, professional ethnics, a welfare, and human value are included in our curriculum. Continuous efforts are being made by the college to increase its performance and implement the important suggestion of students, alumni, staff members, JBS, IQAC, etc.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The main basis of the academic system of the college lies in its teaching and learning process. In order to make this process effective and smooth, innovative plans and strategies have been introduced:

1. Programs for extracurricular activities, along with curricular activities, are conducted by the college as per the Academic calendar.
2. Following the reservation policy, students of all classes such as ST, SC, OBC, General category are admitted in the college.
3. The students are made aware of the teaching plan, evaluation process before the start of the session.
4. Efforts are being made to promote of PPT presentation, graphical representations, multidimensional diagrams as required by the faculty member by going beyond the chalk and talk method.
5. Efforts are being made to promote the use of online lectures, presentations through information technology; the work of replacing the Blackboard with Green board in all the classes is almost completed.
6. Along with curricular activities, students are made to participate in practical work, survey planning, NSS camp, sports activities to connect with the real world and external exposure.
7. Debate, quiz competition, essay writing competition are organized to enhance critical thinking, understanding and speech skills among students. For the moral upliftment of students and development of personal qualities, birth day of great personalities, scholars, leaders are observed.
8. For slow learners, faculty members solve their problem by taking extra classes.
9. College encourages its faculty members to join seminar, workshop, orientation courses, and refresher courses.
10. The teacher's diary is monitored by the principal to ensure that the academic activities are delivered effectively.
11. Students' academic progress is assessed by taking class tests.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The College encourages its teaching staff members to attend refresher course, orientation course, seminar and workshop to promote innovation in the college. The college offers undergraduate courses. Which include B.com, B.Sc., and B.A. streams. The syllabus of these has been given place in the syllabus with innovative method and relevant topics.

All the important topics of science, business and humanities are covered in our curriculum. Practical subjects provide the students with the experience of laboratory work and outer exposure, along with curricular activities. The use of modern technology, information technology is encouraged in the college. Our institution constantly strives for technical literacy to promote the use of computer, Internet, scanning, web learning, etc.

During the COVID-19 pandemic people were made aware of the prevention of corona virus by organizing a vaccination program in the college with the help of NSS and initiative of the Red Cross. All interesting activities like tree plantation, cleanliness drive, women empowerment, voter awareness, cycle rally are conducted.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

A strong infrastructure is the first requirement for the smooth running of the teaching learning program in the college. With the commencement of its journey from the high school and Janpad panchayat Bhawan Udaipur in 2006, the college started mobilizing the necessary resources in September 2017, the college shifted in its own a fully equipped building.

Today, the college is spread over 2.5 acre campus, including 1650 square meter build up area in which 10 fully equipped classrooms and 5 laboratory facilities are available. Separate rooms NSS, Red Cross girls common room, principal chamber, exam control room, office available. All basic necessities of teaching learning program like table, chair, Blackboard, Green board are available.

The facility of reading cum library room is available in the college where about 3846 books of different subjects are available. Here, students and staff member get books in literature, competitive exam, novel, essay, poetry, story books in addition to text books.

The college is under constant surveillance with 29 CCTV cameras, electricity, and fan, light facility is available in all the classrooms. Water cooler purifier has been installed for the availability of cold and soft drinking water.

Student Support and Progression

The college implements various activities for its student at the Academic level. At the time of admission students are provided basic information about the college, subject of studies, class plan, allotment of seats, availability of teachers and other information at the time of admission through the admission booklet the eligible students are given admission by following the procedure laid down by the state government:-

- Under the post metric scholarship the amount of scholarship is provided to the students in the quota of ST, SC, OBC, divyang, woman etc. which are directly transferred to their bank account.

- The college organizes various sports competitions, NSS programs, village survey, practical, etc. Programs for the multidimensional development of its student, so that along with the studies, the students get exposure to the real world.
- In the college, students are provided career guidance, necessary employment guidance, and also for preparation of competitive exams.
- The college encourages students to develop technical skills and create employment opportunities and develop traditional work related Skills in their community as well as enhanced agricultural production.
- The college organizes such as Blood donation Camp, National Youth Day program. Cashless transactions, Mask and vaccination awareness, health and hygiene awareness.
- If there is any difficulty related to subject requested by students concerned, extra classes are arranged for them, as well as personal advice from the concerned teacher can be availed.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The college follows the guidelines and regulations of Sant Gahira Guru University along with the guidelines of the Department of Higher Education, Government of CG, and University grant Commission. The management of the college is well organized and progressive under the able leadership of the valuable and experience higher authority.

An effective internal discipline exists in the college under the leadership of the principal. The college runs its management system in a better way through major organization like Janbhagidari Samiti, IQAC, staff Council, different committee Etc.

There is a system of hierarchy in the college, in which arrangements have been made for function by rights, and responsibility at different levels. In the teaching department each subject has the post of a separate head of department, programme officer of incharge of NSS, Red Cross sports. There is availability of official staff at the post of assistant grade-2 to assist in the official work of the college.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The number of girls students in the college is greater than boys students due to which the objective of girls education and women empowerment has been strengthen here. Earlier girls used to get married in early age due to social practces which encouraged child marriage but the active role of college has attracted girls students for education.

Now the economically and socially backwards poor girls students of the tribal area have got the opportunity to join the mainstream in the society through education and stare important responsibility with this the dowry system has become weak and decreased the number of the cases of domestic violence.

Extensive work is being done by the NSS unit of the college for social services, awareness campaign and the grow of nationalism.

New changes are being given direction in the society by cycle rallies, voter awareness program, organizing blood donation camp, drug de-addiction campaign etc. The college provides a platform for the presentation of tribal rich tradition of locality through its various cultural programs. Our institute encourages the multidimensional development of the students in a holistic environment. Important national and international

days are observed in the college and work is done according to the constitutional goals.

2.3 Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Response:

According to the calendar provided by the state Govt and the parent university at the beginning of the academic session, the institution uses various methodologies to enhance the learning process.

As the academic session starts, all the teachers get involved for effective teaching as per the plan. Question- answer session is organized by the teachers in their classes; students are encouraged to ask more and more questions helps in arousing interest in the students, increasing awareness of the subject, and the competition among the students.

Experiential learning is the process of learning by doing, students gain insight into their own competencies, skills, value and passion through experiential, field trip are organized by the department of geography that give students a visual experience and discusses information about new opportunities by giving them exposure.

The first year students are given project work under environment studies, for which they have to practice and work in outer world to collect environmental facts. This work connects the learning process with the real world.

The required elements are used by the college faculty in teaching and learning to the students in an effective manner through PPT presentation, in the science subject, the concept learned from the theory in the classroom by going to the laboratories and doing practical tests are clearly understood, in the observation. Students can record all the practical facts, so that they can explore new knowledge and

research in his practice.

The teaching and learning process adopted by the college

1. Team work- the college encourages the students to work in the spirit of teamwork. Through NSS village adoption NSS camps, tree plantation, covid-19 campaign cashless transaction, swachh bharat abhiyan etc. Efforts are made to work together and develop social welfare as a trend of living everyone's progress is their own progress this feeling has been imbibed.
2. Leadership- to work in the spirit of teamwork, the organisation needs a good leadership, so in every community program it is ensured that the students come forward and take the lead and take decision in the interest of the group. The skilful, right direction of the group and the spirit of taking everyone along in the group are developed.
3. Project work and field visit – practical knowledge is enhanced through activities like exposure to the outer world, field visit etc. along with theoretical studies in the college, programs like drug de-addiction campaign and covid-19 appropriate behaviour were conducted in the villages adopted by the NSS camps, many programs have been organised for voter awareness campaign under the sweep program. Large scale education and dissemination of information through computer, scanner, printer, CPUs, internet connections have been widely supported.

During the period of covid-19 pandemic, ICT was widely used by the faculties of the college; students of all classes were included in whatsapp group in class wise, for which regular classes were conducted through ICT. During this pandemic period, many webinars & seminars were organized. Educational material was made available to the students through Google meet and through zoom meeting. Computer projector, laptop, printer, scanner, facilities are available in the Institution for the use of ICT technology, which plays an important role in the delivery of online content and effective learning.

Before Covid-19 the Institution used to minimum use of ICT, but in the changed situation in the college, a comprehensive change was adopted. Physical Facilities - The government RAJKUMAR DHIRAJ SINGH College started its journey 15 years ago from janpad panchayat bhawan in 2006. During that time the college didn't have facilities like library, computer, and laboratory students used to study and learning with simple facilities in the raw building.

In September 2017, the college shifted to its own new building. The college has established laboratory, library, well maintained classrooms, computers and other necessary facilities.

As –

1. The college campus is spread over a total area of 17 acre (under acquisition process), in which the construction of new college building has been done in 1650 square meter.
2. The college has 10 classrooms with adequate seating capacity, electrification, tube lights, fans etc.
3. There are 5 laboratories with modern equipments of Microbiology, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Geography.
4. The college has a well furnished resourceful library where sitting Facilities are also available. Not only text books are available, but quality books are available.
5. Girls common room is available with all the facilities.
6. A sports and red cross cell is available in the college, where all the sports equipment are kept.
7. In case of power cut 12 volt capacity battery is available in the college.
8. The college has its own bore well with 24*7 clean water supplies; facility of overhead water tank is also available.
9. The facility of a Hall, an examination control hall, an NSS office, a sports room, an office room, principal chamber and teaching staff rooms are available here.
10. There are two computer system, two printers, and one photocopy machine.
11. 29 CCTV cameras have been installed in the college campus so that the entire campus remains under constant surveillance.
12. Moving beyond the chalk and talk method, now the college is promoting the use of technology to provide education through online platform.

Laboratory –

The laboratories of our Institution is maintained and up to date by the respective teachers, regular cleaning and necessary repairing of equipments are carried out.

Innovative and good quality practical tools have been installed to give the students a good practical experience and to clear the basic understanding. Separate labs rooms have been set up for each practical department; teachers support in the practical work of the students. Classroom –

The college has 10 classrooms; great attention has paid in the classroom to make the teaching learning program effective and hassle free. There are facilities like furniture, tube light, fans available. Classroom, furniture, Electricity supply, water supply, of different departments as per the instruction given by HOD's And principal, Maintenance of everything are completed.

Sanitation –

Adequate number of bathrooms and toilets are available in the college. Separate arrangements have been made for students and staff members. Separate washrooms have been made for male and female. Where there is adequate availability of basic amenities. Facility of water, electricity, exhaust fan is available, cleaner has been appointed for cleaning and maintenance work of washroom. The performance of all the teaching and non teaching staff is continuously monitored by the principal and immediate action is taken for necessary improvement, the performance appraisal of all the teaching and non teaching staff is communicated by the principal to the higher officials of the higher education department.

The performance Based appraisal system in the college is designed to measure the performance of the teaching staff as per the UGC regulations. At the end of each Academic session, the confidential report in the prescribed format is to be filled by the teaching and non teaching staff. Teaching staff has to fill and submit the API Performa, which contains the proofs of all their Academic activities.

The scrutinized detail are sent by the principal to the higher authority. Promotion of teaching and non teaching staff is decided on the basis of their confidential report.

All the accounts in the college kept by accounts section of the college, are supervised by the draunit and disbursing officer/principal.

Availability of better utilization of funds are very important for any Institution or organization. The college receives salary and non-salary grant from the state govt.

The budget is allocated on the necessary issues after analyzing the proper utilization of government funds by the development and purchasing committee, monitoring work of all financial activities is done by principal/DDO.

The scholarships are awarded to the students and the amount is directly transferred to their account. Fee received during admission is transferred to Sant Gahira Guru University Ambikapur. A certain percentage of which is forwarded to Chhattisgarh government. Keeping all the essential requirements in mind, the Purchasing Committee ensures the purchase of quality items.

By Stablishing a balance between the availability of fund and the purchase of goods, efforts are made to purchase all the necessary items from the available amount. To ensure the availability of basic facility in the college a fund has also been created, through which water and electricity supply, Telephone bill, Magazine, papers, Stationary, Website maintenance, and all purchasing is done.

To upgrade the effective teaching learning process, seminars, workshops, quiz competition, Debate competitions are organized for teachers and students, in which the coming expenses are included in it. Some fund is kept in reserve for urgent requirement when the college is required, the proposal of the concerned financial demand is made and sent to the higher authority.

- Beliefs on traditional tribal rural costumes.

Context :-

Government Rajkumar Dhiraj singh College has been established in tribal rural area, where mainly students from tribal community Come to get education. This area is economically engaged in various activities of priority sector where community spirit is already present. In tribal culture, all the activities of Subsistence

are completed only through Community Cooperation. Through NSS, work is being done to nurture this spirit of the students.

students get practical experience of getting education by working in the spirit of community service and through awareness Campaign, the evils Spread in this area are opposed , and scientific attitude is also developed in them. Due to the lack of literacy in the tribal area, the pace and growth of economic, political, social development is slow, therefore, through Community service, creating attraction for education among the tribes and making them aware of their rights is the content of the program of NSS.

Practice:-

7 days NSS camp is organized by the NSS wing of the college to engage the People by doing community service. NSS program has been organized in village PUTA (2017), PANDARIPANI (2018), MRIGADAND (2019), SONTARAI (2020) DOOMARDIH (2021) by the NSS unit of our College. Various Community works were done by NSS Unit in these adopted villages like:-

- * People were made aware to stay away from harmful addiction like, smoking, alcohol etc. through drug de-addiction Campaign, as well as through, slogans and songs by NSS volunteers, villagers were made aware of its Socio- economic consequences.

- * By organizing camps in adopted villages, People were made aware on issues like environmental awareness, sustainable development. The use of degradable items was emphasized by limiting the use of plastic.

- * Villagers are made aware about tree plantation through NSS unit and its importance highlighting through various slogans.

- * cleanliness drive was carried out at places of Community use like Community hall, Pond, temple, courtyard, Public fare, weekly market tourist Place etc. and People were made aware about cleanliness.

- * The villagers are encouraged by the NSS unit for the Compulsory use of Masks, during the CoviD-19 Pandemic; Various Perceptions were spread in rural areas about covid-19 vaccination, which was made aware by the volunteer's.

- * Villagers were made aware to take advantage of schemes related to the Panchayat sector and the working of the three-tier Panchayati Roj system was better explained.

- * By providing information to the People about the new techniques of water Conservation and water management, people are motivated to apply them to conserve underground water level.

- * People are made aware about the necessary health tests, Vaccination nutritional supplements, government avail health services and schemes for the nutrition of pregnant mothers, and her child.

- * Remedial advice was provided through legal provisions to deal with social evils like child marriage, dowry system, infanticide, domestic violence.

- * Information about various production techniques and programs were made available for economic development.

* The tribal Community is motivated to preserve their rich culture tradition by avoiding the ill effects of globalization, Pop music and western culture; it was made aware to maintain faith and belief in generational values.

* Exemplary work has been done to establish service spirit among the People by organizing blood donation camps, vaccination programs, organizing cleanliness campaigns in the Campus and organizing effective programs like slogans, rally, Painting, Posters and other community activities. Celebration of: -

- World Bicycle Day on 3rd June.
- World environment Day on 5th June.
- National Youth day on 12th January.
- Voter awareness Campaigns under sweep program on 25th January has been organized.

Evidence of success: -

Through the awareness campaign run by the NSS Camps, awareness has increased among the People about their rights and duties; they have become aware of their constitutional, economic, social and Political rights. The villagers have become aware of the protection of the tribal cultural heritage and are involved in the development of their culture Parallel to the western culture.

During the Covid-19 Pandemic, the villagers used masks and were vaccinated in the vaccination program organized in the college Campus; Evils like child marriage, dowry system, drug abuse etc. have been curbed girls students are attracted towards education in the College. There has been a lot of Positive change in People towards the use of new technologies like mobile, internet; They are using technology to make their life easy and simple. Instead of Plastic bags and Polythene, the villagers have promoted the use of DONA- Pattal, Jute bags etc.

Limitations:-

1. NSS programs couldn't be implemented actively since last 2 years, due to Covid- 19 Pandemic.
2. Most of the People near college Campus villages are not literate so there is difficulty in making them aware technically, economically, politically, constitutionally.
3. Regional alcohol drinks are more prevalent in the tribal tradition.

Note: - There is a need to implement the programmes of NSS, effectively and motivate People to Connect with it, with community support and appreciation the broader goal of Public service by NSS can be fulfilled, this develops the spirit of service, discipline, goodwill and cooperation among the People, as well as the multi-dimensional development of the students is Possible.

After the construction of the college building in September 2017 it is shifted in its new building. The College is situated in forest village land in tribal rural area where the demarcation of land and boundary is under process.

Despite all this problems, the college is completing the academic works efficiently and is constantly striving to perform better in all dimensions. To prepare students for the future responsibilities of society and nation through education, making them self-reliant, developing scientific attitude, making them aware of their rights and duties etc. are clearly included in the mission and vision of the college. 1. An active unit of NSS is functioning in the college, through which awareness campaigns are conducted by organizing camps in the surrounding rural tribal area and people are educated on various issues, Labor donation is done for cleanliness of Ponds, river ghat, Public places and place of worship.
2. An awareness campaign is conducted under the banner of NSS and Red Cross unit of the college to make People aware of health and hygiene, During the Covid- 19 Pandemic, the villagers were vaccinated by organizing a Covid-19 vaccination program in the College building, social distance and People were encouraged to wear masks.
3. Through the blood donation camp, young students of the college donated blood and People were also appealed to join this program.
4. Posters slogans, street plays (NUKKAD NATAK) were staged to motivate people who had completed 18 years to vote through the SVEEP Program.
5. Awareness is communicated to the people on issues like child marriage, drug abuse, Tonhi witchcraft harassment, spread in rural culture and legal provisions related to it are interpreted, such as The Tonhi harassment act- 2005.
6. People are motivated to develop eco friendly habit to spread awareness on issues like environmental protection, sustainable development, water and Soil conservation, tree plantation, rain water harvesting, use of bio-fertilizers, organic manure and other alternatives.
7. People are made aware by bringing them together in programs like National Youth Day, Quami Ekta Day, Road Safety week, Eye Donation Forthight, Tree - plantation month, to promote compulsory use of helmets, wearing helmets is ensured for motorcyclists in the College.

8. The Participation of students as well as the local people are ensured in the AIDS prevention program, drug prohibition program, legal literacy program and cleanliness campaign program so that they can become aware.

9. The College believes in gender equality, socially people are being made aware through education to get women equal status with men. The College has attracted girls' students to get education, as a result of which the number of girls students in the college is more than boys students.

10. Sanitary vending machine and girls' common room have been arranged for the health and hygiene of the girls' students.

11. The College motivates its students to become proficient in regional traditional professional skills to make them self-reliant.

12. Regional Cultural program is promoted in the cultural programs of the College, it develops Community spirit.

13. Through the mentor- mentee Program, the students are given counseling for the diagnosis of mental dilemma, mental stress, isolation difficulty and behavioral problem. Through this program, students are motivated to stay connected with their community and contribute to Community service, During the Covid- 19 Pandemic; the work was done by the students to make their regional Community aware of vaccination, wearing masks. Similarly, the work of protecting against evils like alcoholism, domestic violence, child marriage and motivating people to stay away from it, to be done.

14. In order to contribute more to the community service through education, the college ensures that the college should be accessible to all for all aspects related to education.
